# WITH TRULY THANKFUL HEARTS

Momentum is building for the campus improvement projects we'll be undertaking soon!

At January's Annual Parish Meeting, parishioner Ben Latham told us about four specific projects we'll be taking on:

- An addition to the Common Room that will house much-needed restrooms.
- Renovations to the Common Room, making it more attractive and usable.
- Transformation of the West Lawn into a landscaped courtyard that will feature a permanent labyrinth.
- Renovations to the Lower Level, updating the Youth Room, reconfiguring the Nursery, relocating our Prayers and Squares ministry, and creating a new meeting room / classroom.

Conceptual drawings for these projects are available in the Common Room, and they've certainly provoked some good conversation.

The theme for our campaign is "With Truly Thankful Hearts." This phrase comes from the Book of Common Prayer's General Thanksgiving (p. 101). This prayer reminds us that God is the source of all our blessings, and it calls us to be generous as give thanks for what we've received from God.

Our beautiful campus is certainly a blessing for which we can be thankful. Our buildings house a great variety of liturgies and ministries and classes. We can give thanks for God's abundant blessings, as well as for the commitment of people who have gone before us, who offered so much so that we can enjoy what has been entrusted to us.

As we give thanks, I hope all of us will be excited about supporting these projects, all of which will enhance our campus and help us minister in the future.

Tony and Kelly Jezek are chairing the Fundraising Committee for our "Thankful Hearts" campaign. They're making plans for several forums in April, so that everyone will have a chance to learn more about these and other projects. You can look for an invitation soon to one of these forums. In the meantime, if you have questions, Ben Latham or the Jezeks or I would be very happy to talk to you. Other committee members include Tom Owens, John Duvall, Peggy Woods, and Tom Schooley, and they also would be happy to visit with you.

If all goes well, we can look forward to beginning construction at the start of summer. That's not very far away. Please keep the campaign in your prayers. I look forward to embracing with you this chance for us to make some important improvements to our beloved buildings and grounds.

# Bell Lecturer at Saint John's

### "Making the Reformation Visible: art in the Church of England after 1550".

Clare Haynes is this year's William H. and Rita Bell Lecturer in Anglican and Ecumenical Studies at the University of Tulsa. She delivered the annual Bell Lecture at TU in February. And she'll be offering another presentation at St. John's in April!

Dr. Haynes will speak on Sunday, April 14,at 9:00am in Powell Hall. Her presentation will fit in with the series that our own Dean Luthey has been teaching, although even if you haven't been attending Dean's class, you'll enjoy Dr. Haynes' presentation very much. The Reformation changed the relationship of art and religion in very significant ways. In this class, we'll explore how images were first destroyed and how, gradually, new forms of art were introduced. Against this background, we'll look at some modern English church interiors too, and consider the ways art is used in worship today.

# SABBATICAL FAQ

Last month's column on sabbaticals for the Rev. Irv Cutter and the Rev. Susanne Methven prompted many questions. Here are answers to some of them.

#### Q. How long will the sabbaticals last?

A. Clergy normally accrue two weeks of sabbatical leave for every year of service. Susanne is planning a 12-week sabbatical beginning this August. Irv is planning a 14-week sabbatical leave beginning May 2014.

#### Q. How will the sabbaticals be funded?

A. The clergy get a continuing education allowance every year. Each year, the yearly amount that was not used has been set aside for sabbatical purposes. So both Susanne and Irv have built up some initial funds for their sabbatical projects. There should be no other impact on the Operating Fund. Both Susanne and Irv plan to write grant requests to cover the costs of their sabbaticals.

#### Q. What are the plans for these sabbaticals?

A. Both Irv and Susanne are still firming up their sabbatical plans. They are working independently to develop plans that will be refreshing and spiritually and intellectually nourishing for each of them. The sabbaticals may involve some travel, study, time for spiritual retreats, or simple quiet time. They'll keep the Vestry informed of their plans as the plans develop.

#### Q. How will the work get done while they're gone?

A. Irv and Susanne anticipate covering for each other in various ways. So, for example, while Susanne is gone, Irv will take on some of her regular pastoral care ministries, and while Irv is gone, Susanne will take on some of the ongoing supervisory responsibilities and will work with the Wardens on Vestry-related matters.

Liturgical duties like preaching and officiating at services (including Sunday services, midweek services, funerals and weddings) are already shared among the various clergy, including the Curate and our Priest Associate, the Rev. John Rule. So there will be plenty of clergy coverage during Irv's and Susanne's sabbaticals. But these seasons might also be good opportunities to bring in some guest preachers.

If you have other questions, feel free to talk to either Irv or Susanne! Sabbaticals are supposed to be good for clergy *and* for their congregations. So both Irv and Susanne look forward to sharing their plans with St. John's in the months ahead, and they look forward to sharing the fruits of their sabbaticals with the congregation afterwards.

We began in January with Genesis. April will cover First and Second Kings, First and Second Chronicles, and Ezra.

**The English Reformation.** From January through May, Dean Luthey's class, which meets in Powell Hall, covers the reign of Mary, including the burning of Archbishop Thomas Cranmer, author of the Book of Common Prayer; the reinstitution of Roman Catholicism in England; Elizabeth's re-establishment of the Protestant faith; James I and his Bible; the Stuart excesses; and the civil war of Oliver Cromwell and the Puritans.

**Inquirers' Class.** The Rev. Susanne Methven invites you to consider this class if you are experiencing a yearning for a deeper relationship with God and others at Saint John's. The class is based on The Book of Common Prayer. Seekers worship, discuss and learn new practices to help with their discipleship, as well as learn about our church and traditions. This class is also preparation for making an adult affirmation of faith when the bishop comes in June.
